The Genealogy SA Library is the home for our collection of genealogy and family history information resources. It is predominantly a reference library, although some books are available for loan to members. The Library holds the largest collection of family history information in South Australia and specialises in South Australian genealogical material.

The Library Catalogue

Our catalogue holds in excess of 42,000 items, and is searchable online. It's recommended to search before you visit, so that you know what you're looking for: https://saghs.softlinkhosting.com.au:443/liberty/

When searching our catalogue, please note that only 500 items in display in the search results – there may be more items than 500!

Borrowing

Some of our collection is reference-only, and some is available for loan to members. Look for the big orange dot on the spine – these books are available for a 1-month loan.

Navigating the collection

To find items in the library, you will need to find its call number on the catalogue. You can then look at top and end of the shelves to find the right area of the collection. For most items, the area is listed as a series of letters at the end of the call number (except family and local histories, which are at the start).

Family Histories: Example call no. FH/BUT

These are mostly SA Families, indexed under the family name to make it easier to browse for your family name. We index family names on our library catalogue if there are 3 generations of the family line. We do not index all families in the book there are too many. Family names on the Library catalogue appear as 'Smith Family. (711)'. This just means that there are 711 references to the name 'Smith Family' in the Library catalogue, not 711 books just on the 'Smith Family'.

- Loose-leaf Family Histories: Example call no. FH Cabinet H or FH In Storage A
 We have items also that are loose leaf these are family histories given to us.
 These are in the filing cabinets in the member's room. Larger items in looseleaf
 folders are located upstairs In Storage and can be collected by our library
 volunteers.
- Local Histories: Example call no. LH/BURRA

We own approximately 2500 SA histories. They are filed on shelves by place name. Don't forget to check by other place names, such as Barossa Valley for Angaston.

South Australia: Example call no.REF/BUT/A/SA
 This collection includes businesses, history, occupations, and indexes.

- Cemeteries: Example call no. REF/CEM/A/SA (state will change at the end)
 These can be found in the green folders SA cemeteries. Also includes books and indexes about cemeteries from other Australian States. These items have a headstone icon on their spine..
- Newspaper indexes and Advertisers with personal notices from the 1970s onwards.
- DNA: Example call no. REF/RUT/DNA
- Shipping: Example call no. REF/PAS/A/SHIP Books/ logs / indexes/ Passenger lists/ Diaries.
- Writers Group: Example call no. REF/MON/WG
- Indexes: Example call no. REF/MAR/A/SA/IND
 Held in various parts of the collection
- Large books: from all collections, as they fit here easier
- New Books: Most recently catalogued books added into the collection.
- Rare books: Either rare, expensive or unique. Ask for access.
- **Unbound journals**: filed by State, country. More are going to digital versions and will be available on our Reading computers in the near future.
- Magazine: These have several possible locations: the shelves behind the reception
 desk or the actual shelves by the location where the journal is produced (i.e. The
 title Aberdeen & North-East Scotland Family History Society journal, could be filed
 in the Scottish section). Or, if before 2010, they could be upstairs in storage, which
 Library volunteers can collect.
- Photograph: Some photos can be viewed directly from the catalogue, while other
 may have restrictions in place due to copyright. This will be specified in a note:
 "Restricted Image can be viewed at SAGHS Library only". Office staff can give
 access to look at these photo in the library, and we hope to have them accessible
 on our Reading computers in the near future.
