Each record describes an admission to a hospital, asylum or lying-in homes (including a petition for entry for lunatic asylums).

The Adelaide Lunatic Asylum was the precursor of the Parkside Lunatic Asylum. The Adelaide Lunatic Asylum changed to the Consumptive Home from 1902. According to the published history, the Parkside Lunatic Asylum was founded in 1870, renamed Mental Hospital in 1912, and Glenside Hospital in 1967. Initial creation by David Buob.

The Adelaide (later Royal Adelaide) Hospital admission records often recorded the name of the ship the patient arrived on into, and also how long they have been in, South Australia. Other Hospitals spasmodically did the same.
